SEARCH FOR ACCOMMODATION

We, the STUDIERENDENWERK, offer more than 2.500 rooms in 19 student residences. And this in three cities in the Ruhr area: Essen, Duisburg and Mülheim.

We're a fair landlord. As a public institution, we do not operate for profit, instead we focus on the well-being of our students.

In our offer we have three different types of accommodation: rooms in a shared apartment, rooms on the corridor with shared kitchen and bathroom or single apartments with kitchenette and bathroom.

HEALTH INSURANCE

Anyone who wants to study in Germany must be covered by health insurance. When enrolling, you must present proof of your health insurance. You will also need this proof in order to obtain a residence permit. It is possible that the health insurance you have in your home country also counts in Germany.

If the insurance coverage you have in your home country is not accepted in Germany, you must insure yourself locally. Clarify the insurance question as soon as possible. We will be happy to advise you on this subject.



FIRST VISITS TO PUBLIC AUTHORITIES

Once you have found accommodation and successfully enrolled at your university, you have to register at the residents' registration office. In larger cities it is located in the district office or in the citizen's office for the part of town you live in.

For the registration you need the following documents:

- your passport, perhaps with visa, or your identity card
- rent confirmation from your landlord

After registration you will receive a registration confirmation. Please keep this confirmation! You need this document for example if you want to open a bank account in Germany.

GET A RESIDENCE PERMIT

Which formalities you have to complete depends on your country.

Citizens of an EU country or from Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway or Switzerland

You do not need a residence permit, but you must prove at the residents' registration office that you have a health insurance and that you can finance your studies.

Citizens of a non-EU country

Once you have registered your place of residence with the residents' registration office, you have to visit the foreigners' registration office in your city.

For the first application a fee of up to 110,00 € will be charged. An extension costs up to 80,00 €. You must make an appointment in person and bring the following documents with you

- confirmation of registration by the residents' registration office
- proof of health insurance
- certificate of matriculation
- passport/ ID
- cash for the fee
- if applicable, proof of financing
- if applicable, a health certificate
- if applicable, rent confirmation from your landlord
- if applicable, biometric passport photo

The purpose of your residence determines to what extent you can work!

STUDENT FINANCING


The financing of studies is one of the most difficult and important subjects that international students have to deal with.

As early on as when you apply for a visa and a residence permit you must prove that you have enough financial means to finance your studies in Germany. At the moment the German authorities require proof that you have 8.640 € for one year of studies.

On the whole there is little financial support for international students in Germany. Nevertheless, for those who find themselves in financial distress or have questions about student financing, there is our social advisory service they can turn to for help.

COSTS OF LIVING

The cost of living depends on your lifestyle. However, you cannot influence the average rents or the cost of food and health insurance! On average German students have about 819 € at their disposal.
